



Why Telluride

Telluride has the highest concentration of peaks at 13,000–14,000 ft in the lower 48 U.S. states. The San Juan mountains are a relatively young mountain range, creating beautiful, dramatic peaks. And then there's that Colorado weather: receiving an average of 309 inches of snow annually, it's a playground for lovers of really dry, low-water content powder snow and beautiful sunny days.

Although easily reached via major U.S. flight hubs, it's a 6 hour drive from Denver, which keeps the masses who leave the city to ski for only a few days at bay. This translates to virtually no lift lines. There's also no need for a car. Even if staying in the mountain village, there's a free gondola that runs to Telluride's historic town, taking 13 minutes and offering stunning views.

Telluride has a reputation for being an extreme mountain, but you will find a blue or green run from the top of every lift. For example, the Galloping Goose, a double green run, starts off at 11,815 feet and is 4.6 miles long. Telluride has more than 2,000 acres of skiable terrain and 19 lifts, including two high-speed gondolas. The mountain's 4,425-foot vertical drop can be explored via 149 trails (23 percent of which are beginner, 36 percent intermediate, and 41 percent advanced).

Telluride town has great shopping, dining, and nightlife all in one of the most picture-perfect settings. Mountaintops form the backdrop to the historic main street lined with quaint buildings from an era gone by. Telluride is a town born of America's Wild West days, and you can still see the building where Butch Cassidy robbed his first bank in 1892. Unlike many of the ritzy ski resorts in the Rocky Mountains, it has managed to maintain that unpretentious, bohemian charm over the years.

Founded during the mining boom of the 1870s, the whole town is now a National Historic Landmark, with Victorian architecture and heritage sites.

A collection of immersive guest experiences such as alpine skiing, dog sledding, and ice skating allow guests to engage in Telluride's rich scenic beauty. On Wednesdays, guests can even tour the Wagner Ski Factory, located a 5 minute walk away.

Conviviality is big at Madeline: at 4pm a blast on the alphorn signals the start of après-ski, enjoyed from outdoor sofas offering rinkside views of the skating, or while enjoying s'mores at the Alpine Swim Club.
